Stories and Memories

Maureen Sullivan Dolan, Class of 1961, wrote this editorial in a 1960 'Xavierette' in a regular column entitled:

'Seek and you Shall Find'

"Roll call of the Class of 1961 confirmed the absence of one girl. Joan Cooney did not join her former classmates in the donning of their red bows. She had died last June 22 as a result of injuries suffered in an automobile accident.

"Echoes of squeaky oxfords, a girlish giggle, and sour trumpet notes still linger in the hearts of many Xavierites. Joan is more present to those who knew her

than any other girl in the school.

"Joan had written a mental prayer last Christmas that contained some really beautiful thoughts. She pictured in her mind a cold, blustering winter's night. She was walking all alone in search of the Christ Child's stable. A light suddenly appeared far in the distance and she wondered if this were the Place. She was very, very tired; it seemed so far away from her.

> Trying to walk faster and faster, I finally arrive at the stable. I see Him.

"Joan, a conscientious sodalist, realized that God loved her deeply. In her prayer she asked God for understanding of this love.

> Please help me to see the deep meaning of this love, so that my love may also deepen for You.

"In view of later events, this mental prayer seems almost prophetic. The Holy Spirit inspired Joan to love God deeply: He was preparing her for the journey that she was to take home - her journey to Christ. Joan sought God and found Him."

The Class of 1961 celebrates their 50th reunion this October and will give a \$2000 scholarship in memory of Joan Cooney and Dorothy Esposito. Dorothy also did not make it to the 1961 graduation from St. Xavier's. Dorothy died just six months after cancer claimed her body.

Mary Moran Schone - Class of 1951 lives in Washington, Illinois Mary cannot make this year's 60th reunion but she has a story for you.

I was a 3 lb preemie twin, but my sister lived only three days leaving me an only child. I went to St Pius grade school and then on to St. Xavier's, graduating in the Class of 1951. I dated a few nice gentlemen including Guy Lombardo's nephew who danced like Fred Astaire! I married the last guy I dated who had two left feet. I wouldn't trade him for the world. We had 7 children, 4 boys and 3 girls. And now we have 18 grandchildren and 3 great grandbabies with another on the way in March of 2012!

I've had most of my 'parts' removed or replaced, including two knees and both hips. Even though I fell this past May, dislocating my hip, three days later I still walked on the arm of my husband down the aisle to my grandson's wedding.

My life is too busy to keep the hip in place by wearing a brace, but I'm not telling the doctors that. I keep both myself and hubby healthy. Recently I lost 100 lbs!! And there is no longer need for diabetic medicines.

Even though I retired from the 'Peoria Journal Star' in 1991, where I held many jobs over the years, I have not 'stopped' and continue doing and being there for my husband's, family's and church's needs.

I am unable to join my classmates for our 60th reunion this year. And although I have not traveled to the east in many years, God willing, I plan on attending Homecoming in October 2012.

Helen Veronica Ryder, age 101 her fondest wish was to receive a St. Xavier's Diploma!

Helen Veronica Ryder turned age 101 this past August. Just like most of us, she takes pleasure in telling stories about her life. Given her age she also has time to think about some things she 'wished' she could have accomplished but could not, due to circumstances of family needs or the culture of the era.

A fondest wish of Helen Veronica Ryder, was to receive a diploma from St. Xavier's Academy. Helen took the train from Central Falls to St. Xavier's each day. As she tells so often, when she was nearing her senior year, she had to quit school and go to work because of the economy which placed her in the Depression years. Although she worked and retired from Johnson and Johnson, she also bravely served her country both in WW II and the Korean War, receiving medals for those services. Due to the needs of a well-worn body, Helen resides in an assisted living facility, but she still has a sharp mind. Her nephew and family who visit her often love to listen to Helen's stories of how things were when she was growing up. These younger people find the comparison with today's fast pace and technology, along with food prices and salaries quite fascinating.

Helen Veronica Ryder continues to show those characteristics which were so elegantly developed at St. Xavier's Academy. She is a fine lady and even though there is no school, the St. Xavier Alumnae board ladies wasted no time granting one of her fondest wishes - to receive a diploma from St. Xavier's. The call was out to the board members to find an old diploma to replicate. Lo and behold Anne Marie Cole from the class of 1962 had hers not very far from hand. Using our computer tech skills, the diploma was redesigned just for Helen. Congratulations Helen upon receiving your honoris causa Diploma - a wish come true!

Now that's an S.X.A. story!

Peggy Doherty - Class of 1970 lives in Portland, Oregon.

Peggy shares her appreciation for all the sisters who taught us.

St. Michael's in the 60's used the South Providence Boys Club for PE once a week. I remember I enjoyed this time and liked going there. I actually would do laps at the pool and practice my swimming strokes. One day I became alarmingly aware of two black shoes walking along the outside lane in which I was swimming. Each time I came up for air the shoes were there. I noticed Sister Agnese (now Sister Agnes) as I exited the pool. Fearful that I did something wrong, I braced myself as she was very strict. Then I heard her speak these words, "You know if you keep swimming and practicing like you did, you could be a very good swimmer."

During the rest of my life while lap swimming, I would think of Sister Agnese. I think I heard that she was an athlete when younger and had a keen eye for potential.

Now this story has two implications. The first is that I did not have the best of what we now refer to as self-esteem. The roots of this was an undiagnosed learning disabilty called Dyscalculia which I found out I had at the age of 32. I remember in second grade feeling that math flash cards were a complete mystery and I had no clue on how they worked. Of course this continued from third grade and all the way up to St. Xavier's where they gave up hope on my ever being able to do algebra. That placed me out of college preparatory and affected the rest of my life.

The other impact is an opposite of sorts. Title IX had not become law yet, so women's sports programs did not have equal standing with men's programs in funding or stature. Even though I had the desire and perhaps the ability to participate in sports, the infrastructure did not exist. Six years later when the Educational Amendment became law I had missed the opportunity in scholastic sports.

I was a young woman who received lots of negative feedback. But when given a morsel of a compliment from a tough critic, it stayed with me forever.

God Bless all of the Sisters who gave their lives to teaching!

I went on to graduate college at the age of 32 and had a career in Workforce Training & Development where I worked with corporations in the Portland Community College district. It was a slow rise with challenges, but I did rise to my potential, which was always the dear sisters' wish for me.

Peggy says that you meet St. Xavier graduates all over the planet. In September 2008 Peggy traveled to Ireland to visit relatives. While entering a B&B one morning she heard her daughter remarking to two Sisters of Mercy, 'My mom graduated from St. Xavier's in Providence, RI.' One of the sisters was in the same SXA class as an old friend of Peggy's.
